- East Alternative School, 1150 Whiterock Ave.
- Renaissance Manufacturing Group-Waukesha, Parking Lot, 1401 Perkins Ave.
- Some street parking in the area

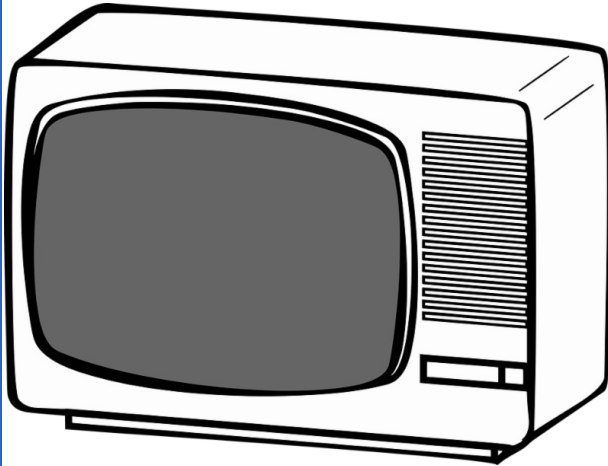
You can also take the Oktoberfest Shuttle. The Shuttle runs every 15 minutes.

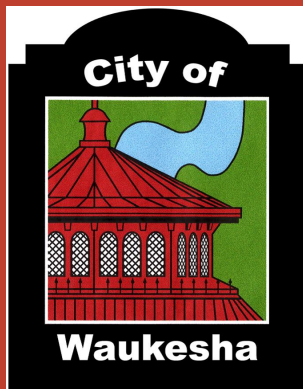
National Preparedness Month
