Water Provider Selected

On Monday, Mayor Reilly and Milwaukee Mayor Barrett made a historic announcement that they have negotiated an agreement for the Milwaukee Water Works to provide a Lake Michigan water supply to the Waukesha Water Utility.

The water sale provides cost efficiencies for both cities while ensuring that Waukesha residents and businesses receive safe, sustainable, high-quality water. A few highlights:

- Costs of building the pipes and other infrastructure needed to connect to Milwaukee are about **\$40 million less** than from Oak Creek.
- Average residential family will pay about **\$200 less per year** with a Milwaukee Water Supply.

Feedback is needed from those inside and outside the City limits. After completing the survey, you may enter your email for a drawing with the winner receiving one of the following prizes:

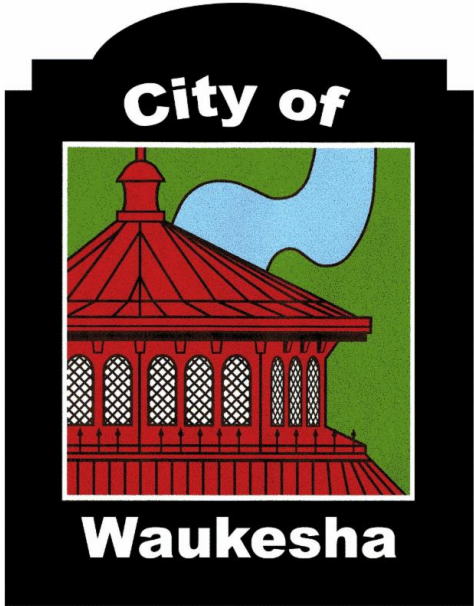

Aldermanic Position Open

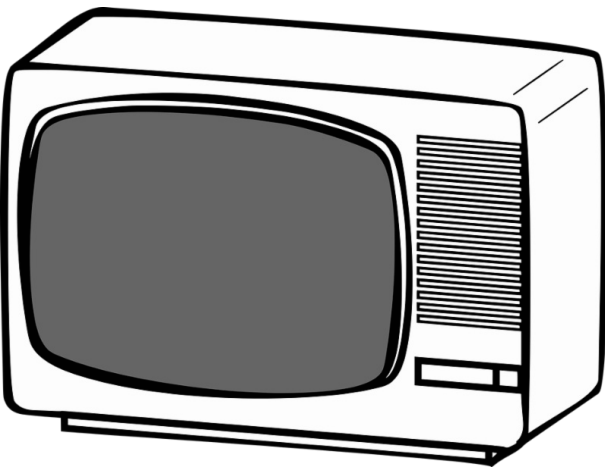
Due to the resignation of Alderman Adam Jankowski, a successor for his District #6 aldermanic seat will be appointed by the Common Council.

TV and Electronics Drop-Off

The next TV/Electronics Recycling collection is THIS Saturday, November 4 from 9am - noon.

There is a \$25 fee for any TV and a \$10 fee for computer monitors which is the fee charged by the City's recycler. All other electronics are accepted at no charge.

Residents should enter the event at 600 Sentry Dr. (entrance to Clean Water Plant) and follow the signs to the drop-off area.

As a reminder, certain electronics (including TVs) are banned from the landfill by Wisconsin State law. They should not be placed in your regular garbage or recycling cart.

Operation Honor: A Salute to Veterans

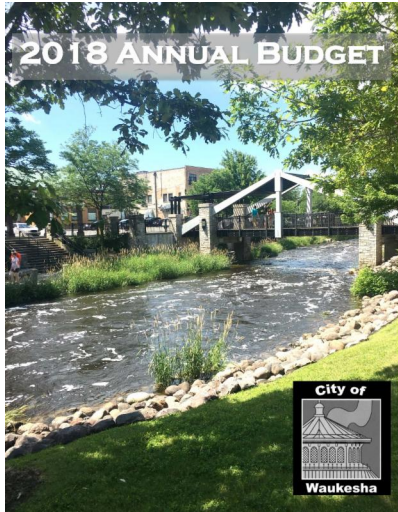

Leaf Collection Continues

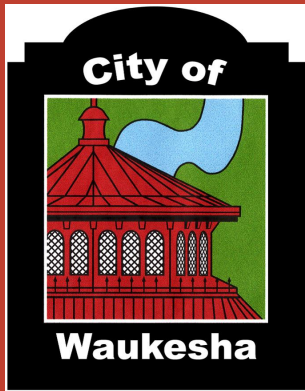
