Water Agreement Approved

At last night's Council meeting, the Common Council voted to approve a contract with the City of Milwaukee to provide Great Lakes water for the City of Waukesha. The City of Milwaukee has already approved the contract.

By signing an agreement with Milwaukee, Waukesha will save around \$40 million on infrastructure costs. This means an average residential family will pay about \$200 less per year with a Milwaukee Water Supply.

When putting up your Christmas tree this year, the Waukesha Fire Department urges you to think about fire safety:

- If you have a live tree, make sure to water it daily. Dried-out trees are a fire danger.
- Make sure your tree is not blocking an exit.
- Keep your tree at least three feet away from any heat source like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.

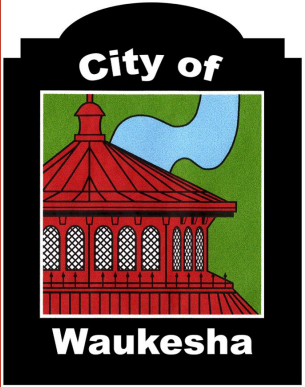
