As there was no garbage/recycling collection on Monday for Christmas Day, all collections are pushed back one day.

- Normal Tuesday collections, picked up on Wednesday, December 27
- Normal Wednesday collections, picked up on Thursday, December 28
- Normal Thursday collections, picked up on Friday, December 29
- Normal Friday collections, picked up on Saturday, December 30.

There will be the same schedule next week as there will be no garbage/recycling collection on Monday, January 1st.

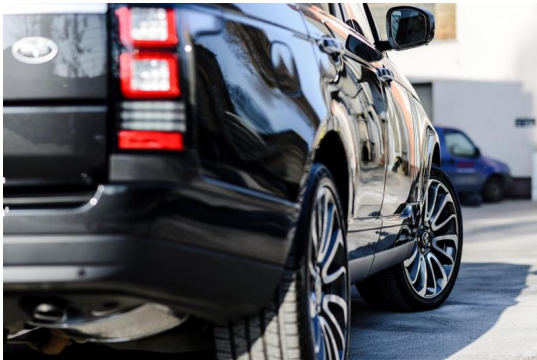
Tree/Wreath Collection

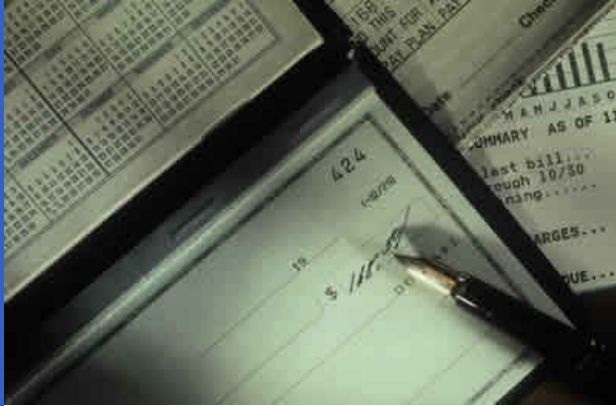

The new 2018 Drop-Off Center season passes are now on sale! The new season pass – which will cover unlimited yard material drop-offs **ONLY** – is \$25. Residents can help to reduce the wait in line on Saturdays by picking up their season pass at the City Engineering office (130 Delafield St. - across from City Hall). Office hours are Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

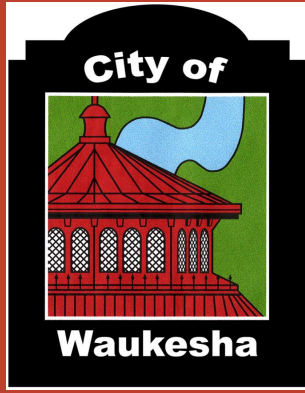


Dog/Cat Licenses

All dogs and cats over the age of 5 months are required to be licensed in the City. Renewals have been mailed to those who had a pet licensed last year.

The deadline to get your licenses is March 31. The fee is \$10 per animal per year for pets that are spayed/neutered. The fee for pets not spayed or neutered is \$15 per animal per year. You will also need to bring proof of a current rabies vaccination.
