## Have Hazardous Waste?

The next drop off day for Household Hazardous Waste in Waukesha will be on Saturday, February 10 from 8am-noon at 900 Sentry Drive (old incinerator).

Waste is generally considered hazardous if it is:

- ignitable (burns readily)
- corrosive
- reactive (explosive)
- contains certain toxic chemicals

Drop off days will take place in the City on the 2nd Saturday of the month for February - March and on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month in April - October.

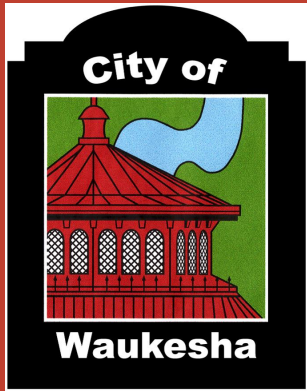
## Trailbreaker Marathon
