The City of Waukesha Drop-Off Center will resume Wednesday hours next week on April 4th. In addition, to the year-round Saturday hours (8am-4pm), the center will be open Wednesdays from 11am until 7pm from April through November.

When thinking about the Drop-Off Center, it's important to remember these tips:

- The Center is for City of Waukesha residents and residential materials only.
- It's a great place to bring yard

materials as you work on your yard this spring and summer. Those items should not go in your trash or regular recycling.

- It's a great place to bring your extra household recycling (cardboard, bottles, cans, etc.) if your recycling bin is full.
- It's a great place to bring some harder to recycle items such as scrap metal, oil/antifreeze, cooking oil/grease, and empty propane tanks.

Celebrate Earth Day by forming a team and cleaning up Downtown Waukesha or one of your favorite neighborhood parks on Saturday, April 21.

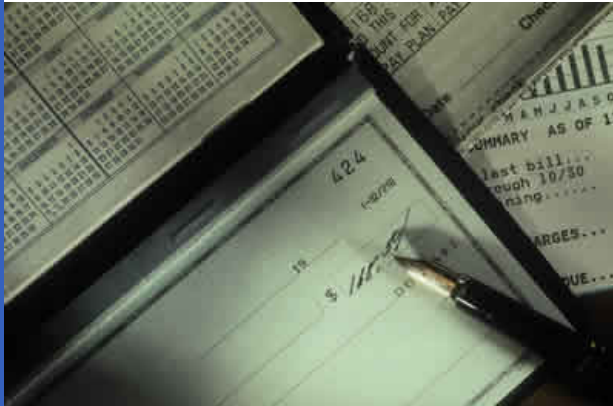

Do you know a person or business who has contributed to historic

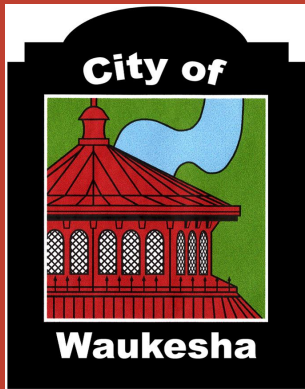


preservation/restoration of Waukesha's rich architectural history?
