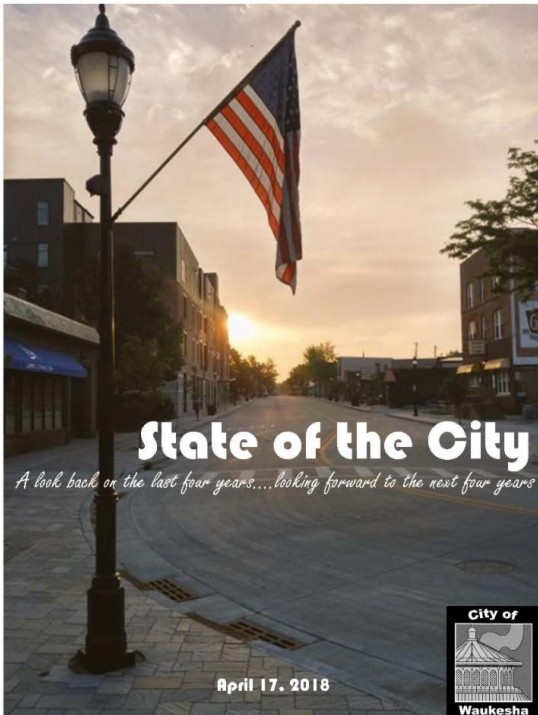

Water Utility Spring Flushing Program

The Water Utility is starting their Spring Flushing Program at the end of this week and will be continuing the program through approximately May 31, 2018. (They did not start on Monday as planned due to the cold temperatures).

The purpose of the program is to remove settled iron particles from within the water mains.

When they are working in your area, you may experience low water pressure or discolored water. The discolored water is caused by naturally occurring minerals being stirred up

within the water mains. If you notice discolored water, run cold water in the sinks/showers until the water runs clear.

City Hall Open House

Members of the City Council and City staff are working with an architectural firm to create preliminary designs of what a new and remodeled City Hall could look like on the current City Hall property. The current City Hall was built in 1965 and poses significant safety, maintenance, and operational concerns.

As part of this process, residents are invited to learn about the steps that have been taken so far and to provide input on City Hall. An **Open House is being held in the Council Chambers on May 3rd from 6pm-8pm**. You are invited to come at any time between 6pm-8pm to ask questions and engage with the architects and staff.

Please note, this is just a step in the process. The architects will provide their first update to the full Council on June 19th and will provide a final presentation to the Council on August 7th.



Brush/Branch Pickup

The annual residential Brush/Branch Pickup will take place the week of April 30- May 4.

The pickup will occur on the same day as your garbage pickup. All brush/branches will need to be out on the curb by 7am on the day of pickup.

The deadline to register your children for t-ball, softball, and baseball is **TOMORROW**, Thursday, April 19. All teams practice at local parks.

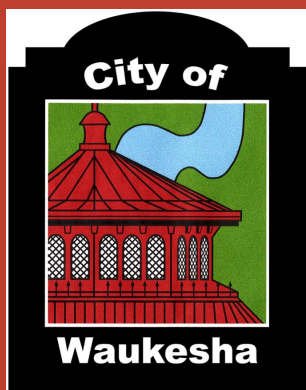
