Last week Thursday, May 3rd an Open House was held to provide information on the current City Hall project.



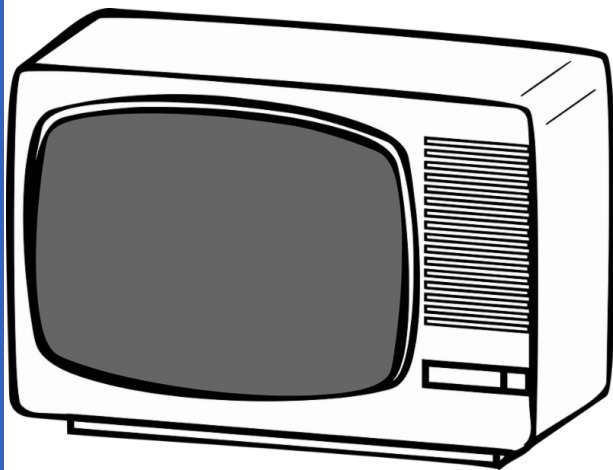

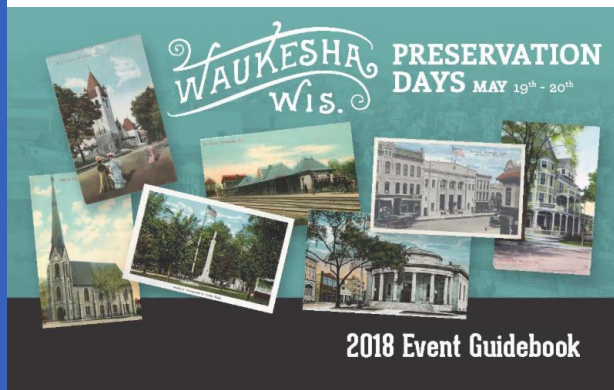

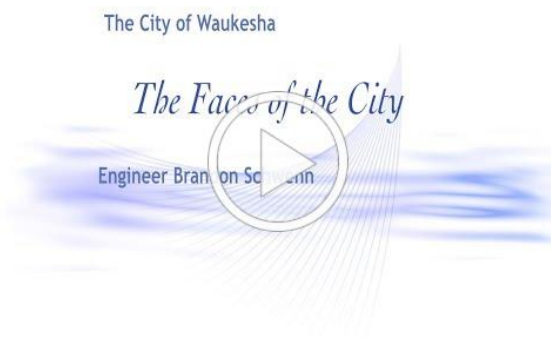
Historic Preservation Days

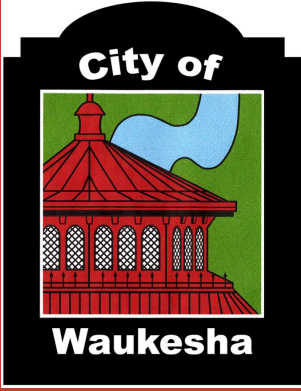


Meet Brandon
