City Hall Project

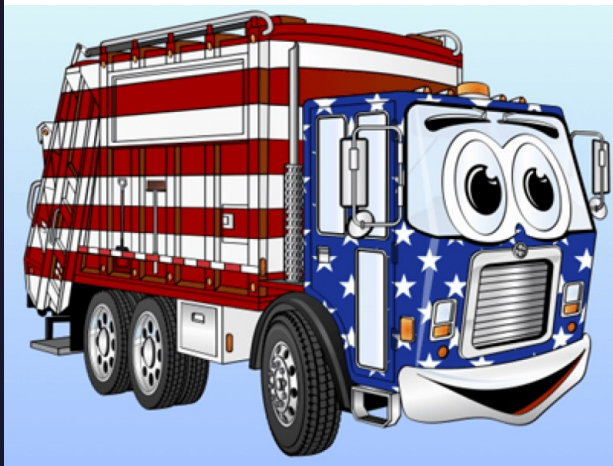


Aldermen and staff continue to work with an architectural firm to develop preliminary designs for an option of a new and an option of a remodeled City Hall.

As you prepare for your 4th of July celebrations, remember, fireworks are illegal in Waukesha.

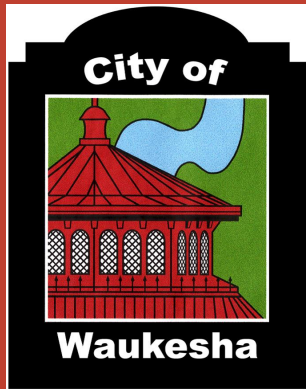
The only type of fireworks allowed are



sparklers on a wire or wood stick not exceeding 36 inches in length or 0.25 inches in outside diameter which do not contain magnesium chlorate or perchlorate.
