- The Canadian National railroad is in town this week through October 5 to make improvements to the Broadway crossing. They are anticipated to work on the Barstow, Culter and Grand Avenue crossings on October 8-12.

in March 2018. The City received a grant to assist in the asbestos abatement and demolition which are taking place now. The City is working with developers on plans to redevelop the property into a tax generating commercial/mixed use development.

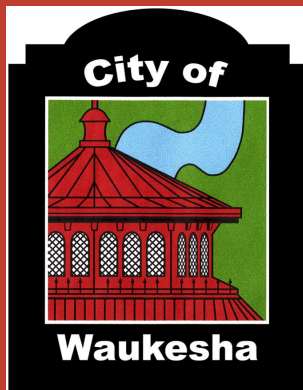
