Fall Leaf Collection

The City's collection of leaves starts this coming Monday, October 15. Starting on Wednesday, October 17 it's free to bring leaves to the Drop-off Center. [You can view the complete schedule here.](#)

The leaf collection schedule is broken down by Aldermanic District. [You can look up your District by address here.](#) Click on "Search by Address" on the top bar.

A few reminders:

- Leaves need to be out on the terrace by 7am on the day of collection
- Leaves should be out loose (not in bags, on tarps, or in containers)
- Do not put your leaves near fixed items such as trees, mailboxes, or fire hydrants

- By the end of next week, the entire roadway including curb & gutter should be paved (weather dependent)
- Sidewalks and driveways are scheduled to be completed the



last week of October and first week of November.

- Final pavement marking and lawn restoration should be completed by the second week of November.

It's **Fire Prevention Week** this week. Remember, "Look. Listen. Learn. Be aware. Fire can happen anywhere."

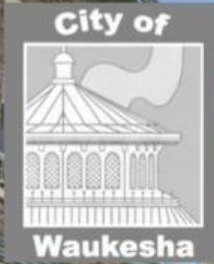
Every year, the majority of fire deaths happen at home. Remember these tips:

- Have a home fire escape plan
- Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home
- Stay in the kitchen or nearby when you are cooking and keep anything that can catch fire away from the stove
- Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet away from heating equipment

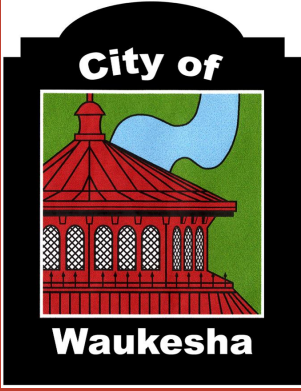
