Fri, Dec. 28 and Jan. 4: Regular Thursday Recycling/Garbage

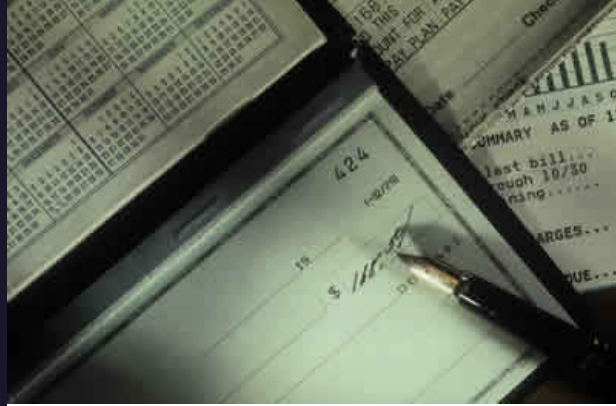
Sat, Dec. 29 and Jan. 5: Regular Friday Recycling/Garbage

Property Tax Information

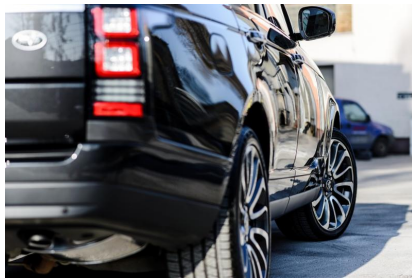


Plan Ahead

- Monday, December 24
- Tuesday, December 25
- Monday, December 31
- Tuesday, January 1

Aside from those closures, City Hall is open Monday-Friday from 8am-4:30pm.

If you Love them, License them



All dogs and cats over the age of 5 months are required to be licensed in the City. Renewals have been mailed to those who had a pet licensed last year.

Why license your pet?

- It greatly improves your chance of getting your animal back if it goes missing
- It lets law enforcement know your animal is up to date on rabies vaccines
- Animal license fees fund animal cruelty, abuse, and neglect investigations.
- State law and City ordinance require dogs and cats to be licensed.

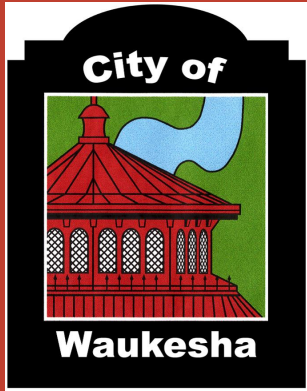
