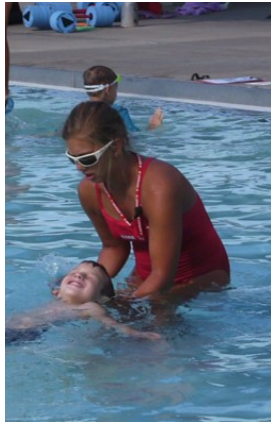

Radon Action Month

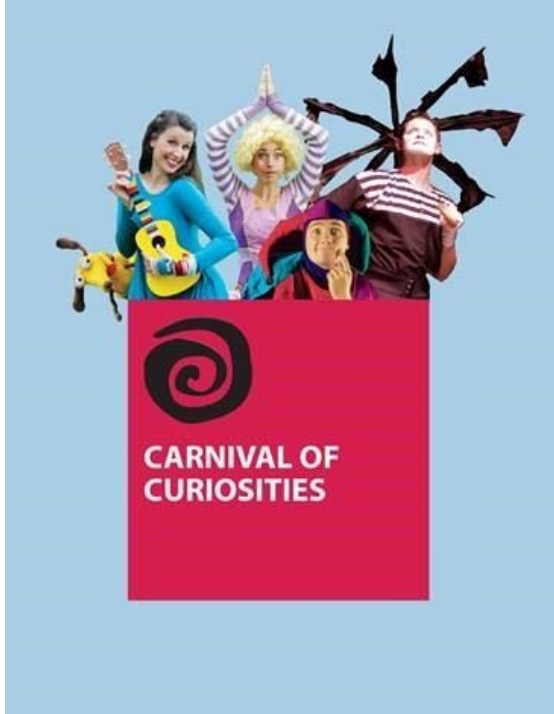

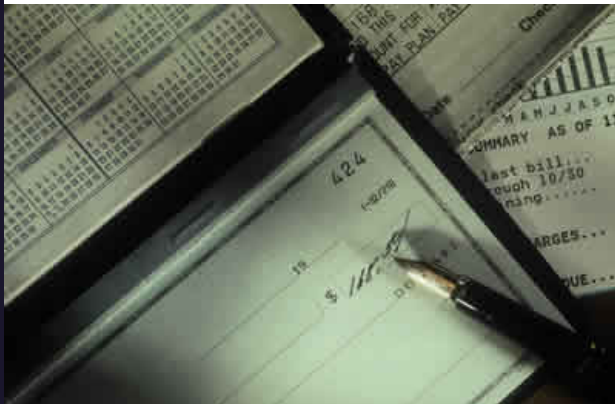


Tree Collection

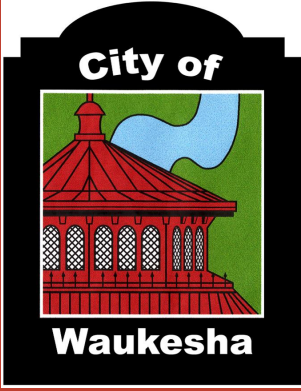


Property Tax Bills
