Thanks to your help, in 2018, the Waukesha Police Department collected **1,206 pounds** of prescription drugs and medications! Since the program started in 2015, the Department has collected **3,253 pounds**.

The goal of this program is to provide a safe, secure and anonymous location to dispose of medications. This ensures that medications do not end up in the wrong hands and do not end up in the water supply.

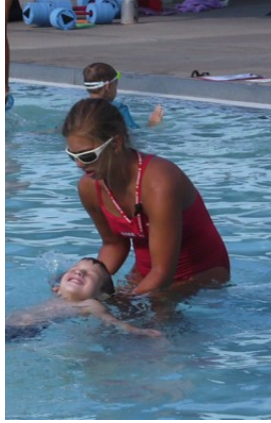
## Try for Free

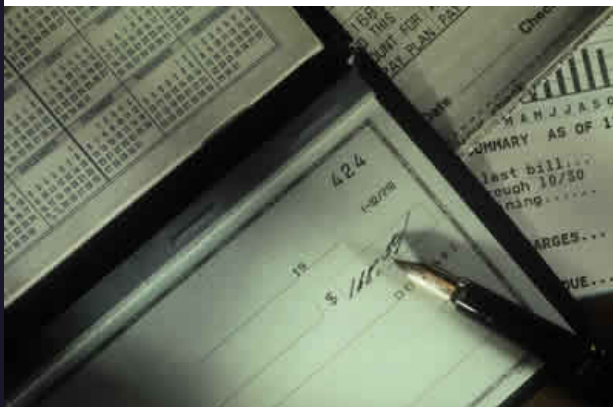


## Tree Collection

## Property Tax Bills

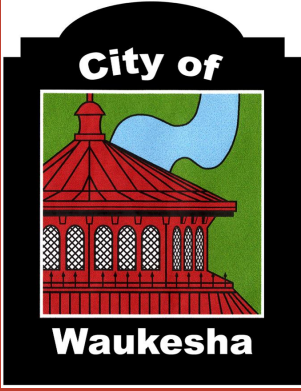
The full payment or first installment of the tax bill is due by January 31, 2019.
