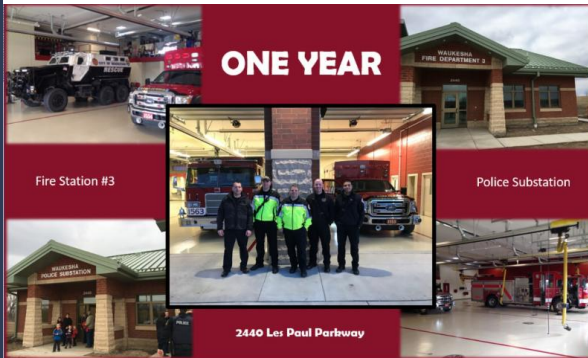


# WHAT'S UP IN WAUKESHA

## One Year Old



The new Fire Station #3 and Police sub-station have been in operation for one year at 2440 Les Paul Parkway!

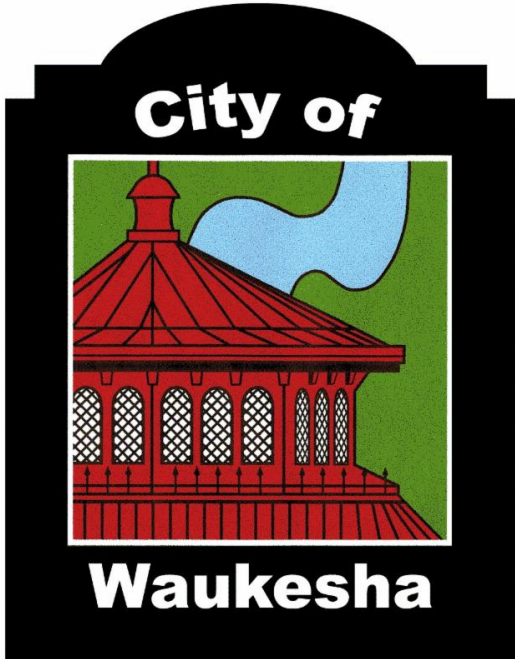
This station was strategically located to allow the Fire Department to respond to all areas of the City with a 7 minutes or less response time goal. In this first year at Station #3, Ambulance 53 and Engine 3 responded to 1,768 incidents with an average drive time of 4 minutes and 20 seconds.

As part of this station, a Police sub-station was built. The sub-station provides the tools and equipment for the Police patrol division to maintain an active presence in the southern portion of the City.

## Mindiola Sports Complex

The City has cancelled the scheduled Public Hearing regarding the project plan amendment for Tax Increment Financing District #14 and the creation of Tax Increment Finance District #26. This would include the planned project for the redevelopment of Mindiola Park and the associated neighborhood. At this point, there is no intention of



attempting to develop a regional sports facility in Waukesha.

### ASK THE PLOW DRIVER

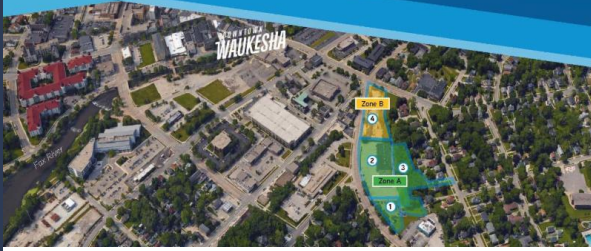
**QUESTION:** I live on a cul-de-sac. Why does all the snow from the whole street get dumped there?

**ANSWER:** There are over 280 cul-de-sacs that are plowed by the City. In cul-de-sacs, the City does need to pile snow on the street to limit the snow from going into driveways. The snow is piled in such a location as to avoid fire hydrants, driveways, mailboxes, catch basins, and utilities.

When time allows following a storm, the Public Work's crews will prioritize hauling out snow from the cul-de-sacs where there is no room for additional snow or where the snow is impacting safety.

The 200-310 Delafield strip mall (across from City Hall) was acquired by the City last spring. The City received a grant to assist with asbestos abatement and demolition which took place this past fall.

The City is currently seeking proposals for the redevelopment of the up to 4.92 acres. The parcels are prime for residential or mixed-use development.

## Overnight Street Parking



When parking on the street overnight, please park on the correct side of the roadway. On odd number days (starting at midnight), please park on the side of the street with odd numbered house numbers. On even numbered days (starting at midnight) please park on the side of the street with even house numbers.

Streets with parking on only one side are exempt.

This helps us to be able to clear snow off the roads. Thanks!

\$15 per pet if not spayed/neutered

## TOP REASONS TO LICENSE YOUR ANIMAL:

- It greatly improves your chance of getting your animal back if it goes missing.
- It lets law enforcement know your animal is up to date on its rabies vaccine.
- Animal license fees fund animal cruelty, abuse and neglect investigations.
- State Law & City Ordinance requires dogs and cats to be licensed.

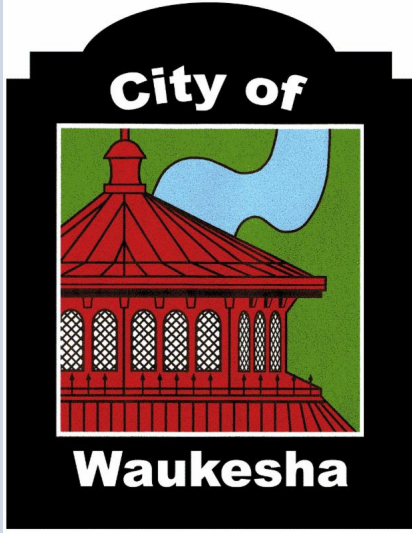
