ASK THE PLOW DRIVER

QUESTION: Why can't I place snow from my driveway or sidewalk into the street? Won't the plow driver just plow it away when they come through?

ANSWER: Blowing or placing snow into the City roadway is a violation of the [City ordinance](#). It is a safety hazard as these patches of snow placed by residents can freeze and cause concerns for motorists, especially on a road that has already been plowed. In addition, as plow drivers are working to clear 1,067 lane miles, extra snow placed onto the roadway can make it more difficult for the plows to clear the roadways.

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal



The next drop off day for Household Hazardous Waste in Waukesha will be this Saturday, March 9 from 8am-noon at 900 Sentry Drive (old incinerator).

Waste is generally considered hazardous if it is:

- ignitable (burns readily)
- corrosive
- reactive (explosive)
- contains certain toxic chemicals

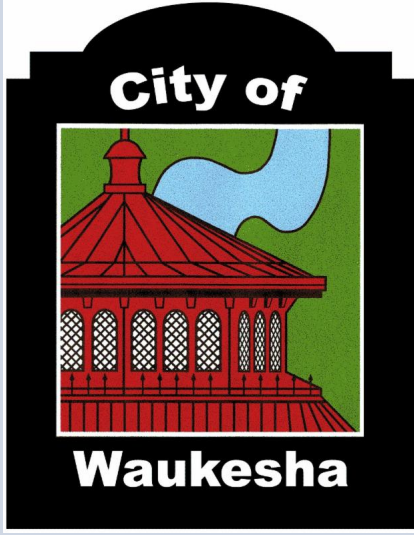
In-person absentee voting will take place at City Hall weekdays from March 18-March 29 from 8am-4:30pm with extended hours on March 29th until 5pm.
