- One lane is closed in each direction on **W. Moreland Blvd** from Delafield St. to Riverview Ave for We Energies work in advance of the road resurfacing project. [More Info.](#)

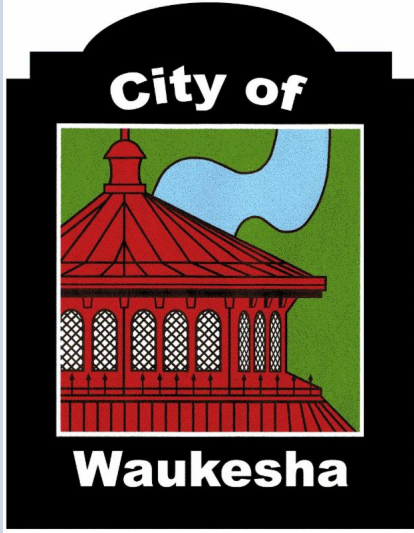
Earth Day Clean-Up
