Recycle Right



Do you know what to recycle in your home's recycling bin? It's important to recycle right and make sure the correct items are ending up in your recycling bin.

Parking permits for City lots or for overnight street parking may now be [purchased online](#).

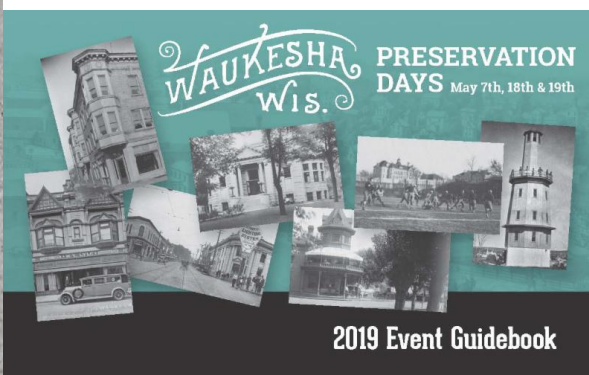
Permits can be bought in 3-day, 30-day, 90-day or yearly increments.

Waukesha Preservation Days

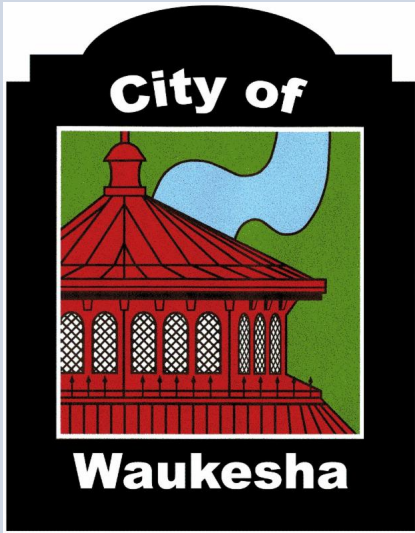


Waukesha's Historic Preservation Days events are taking place on May 7th, 18th and 19th.
