Below is the link to track the Fox River level in Waukesha.

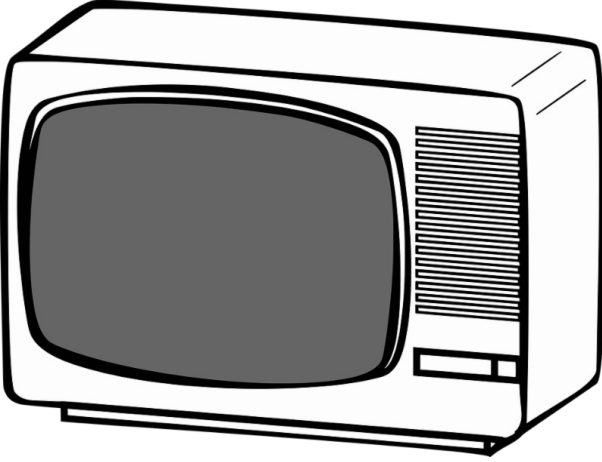
