2020 Public Works Preview

The Department of Public Works is ready to roar into the next decade with an exciting project list for the year!

The city has budgeted nearly \$86 million for 2020 projects: \$19.9 million for the new city hall project, \$12.7 for parks-related infrastructure projects, \$25.7 million for Clean Water Plant projects, and \$36.6 million for road and utility reconstruction projects.

Here are some of the major projects coming this year:

- 1) Construction of new City Hall and Buchner Pool.
- 2) **Barstow St. and Riverfront St. (downtown), S Hartwell Ave., Oxford Rd., Roberts Ave., and Terry Ave.** road and utility improvements.
- 3) **Rolling Ridge Dr., Ruben Dr., and Laura Ln.** asphalt street resurfacing.
- 4) **Hartwell Ave./Lincoln Ave./Broadway** intersection ADA curb ramp improvements.
- 5) **Parking Lot 8 (Grand Ave./Carroll St.)** repaving and rehabilitation.
- 6) **Alleys #12 (Newhall/Scott/Wilson/Grand) and #11 (Wilson, Newhall, Grand, Garfield)** reconstruction.
- 7) **Paving at the Drop-Off Center.**
- 8) **Harrison Ave./Frame Ave./Wabash Ave.** utility improvements.
- 9) **South St. parking ramp** backpainting and painting.
- 10) **Flood mitigation culvert upgrades in Areas #1 and #2 (Rolling Ridge and N University Dr.).**
- 11) **Pebble Valley force main** relay (along University Dr.).
- 12) **Clean Water Plant facility** upgrades for phosphorus removal capabilities and return flow pump station as part of the **Lake Michigan water project.**
- 13) **Westside pump station** consolidation.
