What to expect on Election Day

On Election Day, Tuesday, April 7, the City will have only one polling location. All residents will vote at the Schuetze Recreation Center, 1120 Baxter Street, from 7am-8pm. No other polling locations will be open on April 7th.

Voters are asked to approach the Schuetze Building by coming down White Rock Avenue to Baxter St. Parking is available in the lot next to the Schuetze Recreation building. Overflow parking is available at the Waukesha East Alternative School (1150 White Rock Avenue).

Voters will enter at the main front entrance to the Schuetze Building. Voters who normally vote at: Elks Lodge, City Hall, Rotary Building, Parks Administration Building and EB Shurts will turn right to the Activity Room. Voters for all other poll locations will proceed to the left to enter the gym. There will also be a location for residents who need to register to vote or update their information. There will be signs and personnel directing voters.

Once in voting rooms, voters will state their name and address to a poll worker who will print a poll book sheet. Voters will sign that sheet (instead of a poll book) and take that to the ballot table. At the ballot table, voters will need to show their Photo ID. They will be handed their appropriate ward ballot and proceed to the poll booth.

The safety of voters, poll workers and staff is of the utmost importance. The following will be in place to help keep everyone safe:

- All voters will be provided a mask and are asked to wear it during the duration of casting their ballot. Poll workers and staff will be wearing masks.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at every location for use.
- Tables and poll booths will be wiped down regularly throughout the day.
- Plexiglass will separate the voters from the poll workers.
- Voters will be required to maintain social distancing throughout the voting processing. Cones are in place throughout the voting process indicating the proper distancing required.
- Voters are asked to bring their own black ball point pens to use for voting. If voters need a pen one will be provided that the voter will keep with them.
