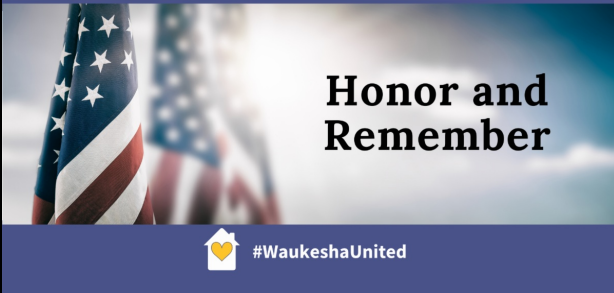

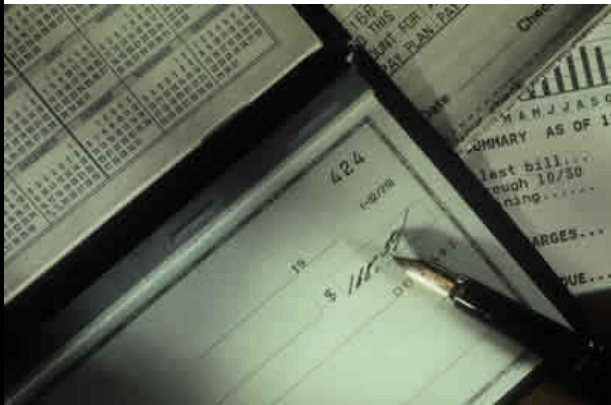
#Waukesha United Challenges

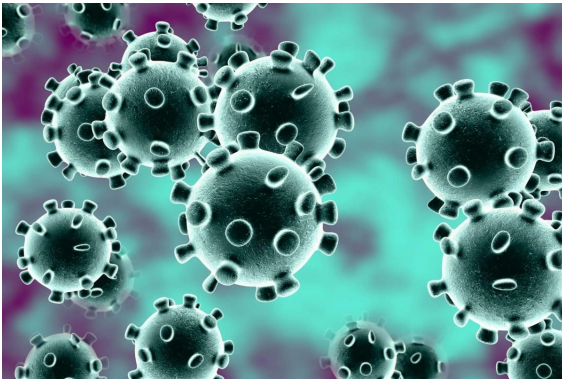
Using Extension Cords Properly

The Fire Department reminds you that May is National Electric Safety Month. One way to prevent electrical fires is to make sure you are using extension cords properly:

- Don't plug extension cords into one another
- Make sure extension cords are properly rated for their intended use, indoor or outdoor, and meet or exceed the power needs of the device being used
- Keep all outdoor extension cords clear of standing water
- Inspect cords for damage before use.
- Do NOT run extension cords through walls, doorways, ceilings, or floors. If a cord is covered, heat cannot escape, which may result in a fire hazard
